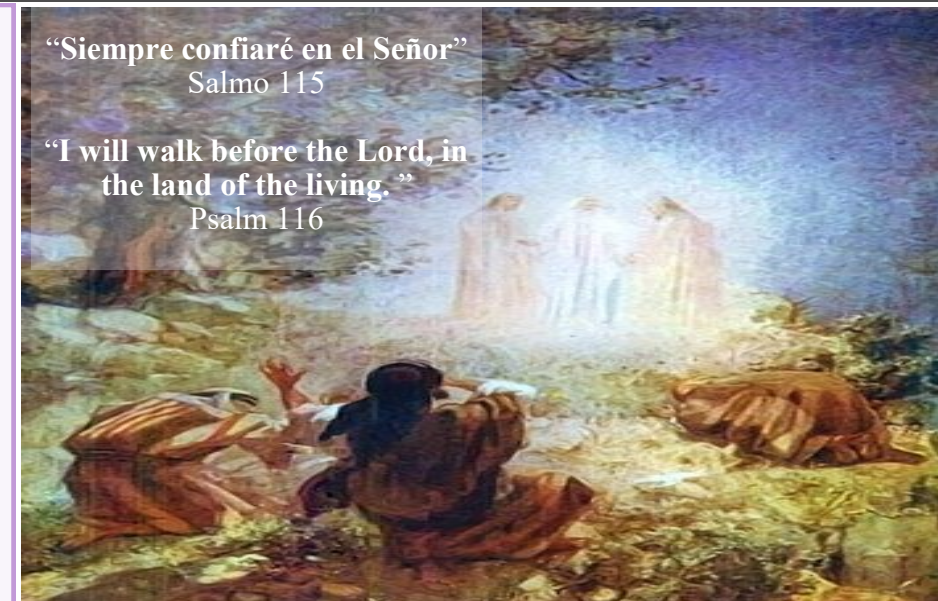

From the Pastor's Desk...

Sunday, February 25, 2024 – Second Sunday of Lent - Cycle B

Readings: Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18, Psalm 116 “I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living.”, Romanos 8:31b-34, Mark 9:2-10

My dear brother and sisters, February 25th marks this year's last Sunday of Black History Month but the call to live in solidarity, faith, hope and joy has not ended. The theme for Black History Month 2024 focuses on “African Americans and the Arts”. African-American artists have used art to preserve history and community memory as well as for empowerment.

The first first stanza of the Black National Anthem goes “Lift every voice and sing. Till earth and heaven ring. Ring with the harmonies of Liberty. Let our rejoicing rise. High as the listening skies. Let it resound loud as the rolling sea. Sing a song full of the faith that the dark past has taught us. Sing a song full of the hope that the present has brought us. Facing the rising sun of our new day began. Let us march on till victory is won”.

Recalling our history inspires us to appreciate the present and fills us with renewed hope and zeal in building a better future. A life full of hope and love founded on the Word of God, which faith produces. Harriett Tubman said “Every great dream begins with a dreamer. Always remember, you have within you the strength, the patience, the passion to reach for the stars to change the world.” It is faith that inspires our dream.

This Sunday’s first reading recounts how Abraham was tested by God. He was asked to sacrifice his son Isaac to the Lord and Abraham agreed. He took the road to Moriah and upon arrival. The Lord provided the ram for the sacrifice. The Lord we serve is not pleased with human abuse. One lesson for us today is the faithfulness of Abraham. He believed in God totally. He had left his land and country, had given up the security of his home and the protection that came from his family and tribe. He was sure that God would keep his promise and give him numerous descendants. But why should God ask him to sacrifice Isaac? Abraham might have had some questions, but he kept his faith in love and fidelity of his Lord. Such faith is worthy of imitation by us. God has promised us love, joy, serenity, peace. But disappointments occur, difficult and painful moments and we could have the impression that God has not kept his promises. The Lord keeps his promise. We are called to trust in him as “we lift every voice and sing till earth and heaven ring. Ring with harmonious liberty. I wish you a happy last Sunday of the Black History Month.

Harry T. and Harriette Moore

Harry T. and Harriette Moore, a Florida couple active in the civil rights movement, paid the ultimate price for the freedoms won for their community when they were killed by Ku Klux Klan members in their own home in 1951. By the time of their death, Florida had the highest number of registered Black voters, far more than any other Southern state.



NAACP branch in Florida

In 1934, the Moores founded a chapter of the NAACP in Brevard County. Initially, Harry kept his job as a teacher, working in an unpaid capacity for NAACP for more than a decade. He fought tirelessly for equal rights for Black Floridians by investigating lynchings, challenging barriers to voter registration, and advocating for equal pay for Black teachers in public schools despite segregation.

By the time of their death, Florida had the highest number of registered Black voters, far more than any other Southern state.

Harry and Harriette were eventually fired from their teaching jobs because of their activism, at which point Harry became a paid NAACP organizer. Eventually, Harry was appointed executive secretary for the Florida NAACP. During his tenure at the helm of the Florida branch, statewide membership grew to a peak of 10,000 members in 63 branches.

Equal pay For Black teachers

With the help of NAACP attorney Thurgood Marshall, in 1937 Harry filed the first lawsuit in the South calling for Black and white teacher salaries to be equal. Although the initial lawsuit failed.

Langston Hughes composed a poem, “The Ballad of Harry Moore”, in the wake of the couple’s death, and in 1952, NAACP awarded Harry the Springarn Medal for outstanding achievement by an African American.

Harry T. and Harriette Moore

Harry T. y Harriette Moore, una pareja de Florida activa en el movimiento de derechos civiles, pagaron el precio máximo por las libertades conquistadas para su comunidad cuando fueron asesinados por miembros del Ku Klux Klan en su propia casa en 1951. En el momento de su muerte, Florida tenía la mayor número de votantes de raza negra registrados, mucho más que cualquier otro estado del sur.

Sucursal de la NAACP en Florida

En 1934, los Moore fundaron una sección de la NAACP en el condado de Brevard. Inicialmente, Harry mantuvo su trabajo como maestro, trabajando sin remuneración para la NAACP durante más de una década. Luchó incansablemente por la igualdad de derechos para los floridianos de raza negra investigando linchamientos, desafiar las barreras al registro de votantes y abogar por la igualdad salarial para los maestros negros en las escuelas públicas a pesar de la segregación. En el momento de su muerte, Florida tenía el mayor número de votantes negros registrados, mucho más que cualquier otro estado del sur. Harry y Harriette finalmente fueron despedidos de sus trabajos docentes debido a su activismo, momento en el que Harry se convirtió en un organizador remunerado de la NAACP. Finalmente, Harry fue nombrado secretario ejecutivo de Florida. NAACP. Durante su mandato al frente de la sucursal de Florida, la membresía en todo el estado creció hasta un máximo de 10,000 miembros en 63 sucursales.

Igualdad salarial para los profesores negros

Con la ayuda del abogado de la NAACP, Thurgood Marshall, en 1937, Harry presentó la primera demanda en el Sur pidiendo que los salarios de los profesores de raza blancos y raza negros fueran iguales. Aunque la demanda inicial fracasó. Langston Hughes compuso un poema, "La balada de Harry Moore", tras la muerte de la pareja, y en 1952, la NAACP otorgó a Harry la Medalla Springarn por los logros sobresalientes de un afroamericano.

Palabras del Párroco

Domingo, 25 de febrero de 2024 - II Domingo de Cuaresma- Ciclo B

Lecturas: Génesis 22, 1-2. 9-13. 15-18, Salmo 115 “Siempre confiaré en el Señor”, Romanos 8, 31b-34, Marcos 9, 2-10

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas, el 25 de febrero marca el último domingo del Mes de la Historia Afroamericana de este año, pero el llamado a vivir en solidaridad, fe, esperanza y alegría no ha terminado. El tema del Mes de la Historia Afroamericana 2024 se centra en “Los afroamericanos y las artes”. Los artistas afroamericanos han utilizado el arte para preservar la historia y la memoria de la comunidad, así como para empoderarse.

La primera estrofa del Himno Nacional Afroamericano dice “Levanten cada voz y canten. Hasta que suenen la tierra y el cielo. Suena con las armonías de la Libertad. Que aumente nuestro regocijo. Alto como los cielos que escuchan. Que resuene fuerte como el mar ondulante. Canta una canción llena de la fe que nos ha enseñado el oscuro pasado. Canta una canción llena de la esperanza que nos ha traído el presente. De cara al sol naciente comenzaba nuestro nuevo día. Sigamos marchando hasta alcanzar la victoria”.

Recordar nuestra historia nos inspira a apreciar el presente y nos llena de esperanza y entusiasmo renovados por construir un futuro mejor. Una vida llena de esperanza y amor fundada en la Palabra de Dios, que la fe produce. Harriett Tubman dijo: “Todo gran sueño comienza con un soñador. Recuerda siempre que tienes dentro de ti la fuerza, la paciencia y la pasión para alcanzar las estrellas y cambiar el mundo”. Es la fe la que inspira nuestro sueño.

La primera lectura de este domingo relata cómo Abraham fue probado por Dios. Se le pidió que sacrificara a su hijo Isaac al Señor y Abraham estuvo de acuerdo. Tomó el camino a Moriah y al llegar. El Señor proporcionó el carnero para el sacrificio. Al Señor a quien servimos no le agrada el abuso humano. Una lección para nosotros hoy es la fidelidad de Abraham. Creía en Dios totalmente. Había abandonado su tierra y su país, había renunciado a la seguridad de su hogar y a la protección que le brindaban su familia y su tribu. Estaba seguro de que Dios cumpliría su promesa y le daría numerosos descendientes. Pero ¿por qué debería Dios pedirle que sacrificara a Isaac? Abraham pudo haber tenido algunas preguntas, pero mantuvo su fe en el amor y la fidelidad de su Señor. Tal fe es digna de ser imitada por nosotros. Dios nos ha prometido amor, alegría, serenidad, paz. Pero ocurren decepciones, momentos difíciles y dolorosos y podríamos tener la impresión de que Dios no ha cumplido sus promesas. El Señor cumple su promesa. Estamos llamados a confiar en él mientras “levantamos cada voz y cantamos hasta que resuenen la tierra y el cielo. Anillo con libertad armoniosa. Les deseo un feliz último domingo del Mes de la Historia Afroamericana.

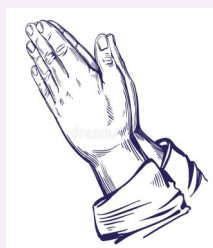
