The Cause for Beatification

History of the Beatification Effort

Finally, in the early 1980s the founding Bishop of Pensacola-Tallahassee, René Henry Gracida, in cooperation with all of the Florida bishops, took steps to open the cause for sixteen Florida martyrs, including three Dominicans (1549), one Jesuit (1566), ten Franciscans (1647, 1704), and two native Indians (1704). In 1982 Bishop Gracida met in Rome with Father Antonio Cairoli, Postulator General of the Franciscans, and he worked with historian Monsignor William Kerr, who was to accept appointment as Vice-Postulator. Bishop Gracida was advised by Cardinal Palazzini, Prefect of the Sacred Congregation for the Cause of Saints and Divine Worship, to put the effort on hold because approval of a new set of procedures for historic causes was expected. Father Alban Maquire, O.F.M., Minister Provincial of Holy Name Province of Franciscan Friars in New York, wrote to Bishop Gracida: “Since in any case a process of canonization takes a considerable amount of time, we can afford to be patient for a few more months.” Yet Bishop Gracida testified that “there is an important story to be told . . . The martyrs have a place in history and are acknowledged by historians. The martyrs should also have a place in our religious memories, so that their lives might inspire and teach that service involves sacrifice” (1983 Report of Bishop Gracida to the Florida bishops)

In July 1983, however, Bishop Gracida was transferred to the see of Corpus Christi, Texas. His successor in Pensacola-Tallahassee, Bishop Symons, determined that funds were not available to continue the necessary research and notified the other Florida bishops. Yet, shortly thereafter, with the blessing and direction of Bishop John Ricard, the effort was renewed as a result of local devotion, including a lay effort to understand the history of seventy-eight acres of land on the east side of Tallahassee (now being held in hopes funding will allow it to become the future site of the Shrine of Mary, Queen of the Martyrs, located approximately a mile from the land Bishop Gracida purchased to build a shrine in memory of the martyrs).

Bishop Gannon's efforts, it should be said, were anticipated and made possible by testimonies from those close to the events themselves. This is true for the Franciscan and Indian martyrs of northern Florida. King Philip V of Spain was so moved by the martyrdoms of the Apalachee Indians of the Mission of La Concepción de Ayubale (Tallahassee) that in August of 1704 he notified Pope Clement XI (r. 1700– 1721) that the Indians “gave their lives in the name of Jesus Christ Our Redeemer, imitating the glorious martyrs of the church, and may their names and veneration be worthy in time.” The Spanish Ambassador in Rome, the IV Duke of Uceda, responded that His Holiness the Pope “heard with great pain such a sad event and (yet) with consolation to see the determination with which they sacrificed their lives for the Faith.” Directed by the Pope, the Franciscans took sworn testimony about the martyrdoms of Franciscans and native Indians. Archival research has brought to light this as well as other rich testimonies. Finally, in 1743, King Philip V, “keeper of the Patronage of the Holy Catholic Church in my Kingdoms of the Indies, by virtue of the ius patronatus that was conferred on me through the successively issued Papal Bulls, to wit, Inter caetera, Eximiae devotionis, Ullius fulcite praesidio, and Universalis Ecclesiae, all of them set and confirmed by His Holiness Pope Julius II, of happy memory, and for all my dominions overseas,” established October 3rd as the day to commemorate yearly the martyrs of La Florida. King Ferdinand VI, succeeding Philip V, ordered the continued celebration of these holy martyrs.

La Causa de Beatificación

Historia del esfuerzo de beatificación

Finalmente, a principios de la década de 1980, el obispo fundador de Pensacola-Tallahassee, René Henry Gracida, en cooperación con todos los obispos de Florida, tomó medidas para abrir la causa de dieciséis mártires de Florida, incluidos tres dominicos (1549), un jesuita (1566), diez franciscanos (1647, 1704) y dos indios nativos (1704). En 1982, el obispo Gracida se reunió en Roma con el padre Antonio Cairoli, postulador general de los franciscanos, y trabajó con el historiador monseñor William Kerr, quien aceptaría el nombramiento como vicepostulador. El cardenal Palazzini, prefecto de la Sagrada Congregación para la Causa de los Santos y el Culto Divino, aconsejó al obispo Gracida que suspendiera el esfuerzo porque se esperaba la aprobación de un nuevo conjunto de procedimientos para causas históricas. El Padre Alban Maquire, O.F.M., Ministro Provincial de la Provincia del Santo Nombre de los Frailes Franciscanos en Nueva York, escribió al Obispo Gracida: "Dado que, en cualquier caso, un proceso de canonización lleva una cantidad de tiempo considerable, podemos permitirnos el lujo de ser pacientes durante unos cuantos años más. meses." Sin embargo, el obispo Gracida testificó que "hay una historia importante que contar". . . Los mártires tienen un lugar en la historia y son reconocidos por los historiadores. Los mártires también deben tener un lugar en nuestra memoria religiosa, para que sus vidas inspiren y enseñen que el servicio implica sacrificio" (Informe del obispo Gracida a los obispos de Florida, 1983). Sin embargo, en julio de 1983, el obispo Gracida fue trasladado a la sede de Corpus Christi, Texas. Su sucesor en Pensacola-Tallahassee, el obispo Symons, determinó que no había fondos disponibles para continuar la investigación necesaria y notificó a los demás obispos de Florida. Sin embargo, poco después, con la bendición y dirección del obispo John Ricard, el esfuerzo se renovó como resultado de la devoción local, incluido un esfuerzo laico para comprender la historia de setenta y ocho acres de tierra en el lado este de Tallahassee (que ahora se mantiene con la esperanza de que la financiación le permita convertirse en el futuro sitio del Santuario de María, Reina de los Mártires, ubicado aproximadamente a una milla del terreno que el Obispo Gracida compró para construir un santuario en memoria de los mártires). Hay que decir que los esfuerzos del obispo Gannon fueron anticipados y posibles gracias a los testimonios de personas cercanas a los acontecimientos. Esto es cierto para los mártires franciscanos e indios del norte de Florida. El rey Felipe V de España quedó tan conmovido por los martirios de los indios apalaches de la Misión de La Concepción de Ayubale (Tallahassee) que en agosto de 1704 notificó al Papa Clemente XI (r. 1700-1721) que los indios "daron sus vidas". en el nombre de Jesucristo Nuestro Redentor, a imitación de los gloriosos mártires de la iglesia, y que sus nombres y veneración sean dignos en el tiempo". El Embajador de España en Roma, el IV Duque de Uceda, respondió que Su Santidad el Papa "escuchó con gran dolor tan triste acontecimiento y (aún) con consuelo ver la determinación con la que sacrificaron sus vidas por la Fe". Dirigidos por el Papa, los franciscanos tomaron testimonio jurado sobre los martirios de franciscanos e indios nativos. La investigación de archivos ha sacado a la luz este y otros valiosos testimonios. Finalmente, en 1743, el rey Felipe V, "custodio del Patronato de la Santa Iglesia Católica en mis Reinos de Indias, en virtud del ius patronatus que me fue conferido mediante las sucesivas Bulas Papales dictadas, a saber, Inter caetera, Eximiae devotionis, Ullius fulcite praesidio y Universalis Ecclesiae, todos ellos fijados y confirmados por Su Santidad el Papa Julio II, de feliz memoria, y para todos mis dominios de ultramar", estableció el 3 de octubre como el día para conmemorar anualmente a los mártires de La Florida. . El rey Fernando VI, sucediendo a Felipe V, ordenó que se continuara la celebración de estos santos mártires.
