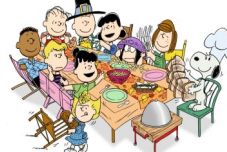

## From the Pastor's Desk...

Sunday, November 12th, 2023 – Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time - Cycle A

Readings: Wisdom 6:12-16, Psalm 63 “My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God”, 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18, Matthew 25:1-13

### The Martyrs of la Florida

Fr. Cáncer's expedition sighted the Florida coast at approximately 27° latitude, somewhere near present-day Bradenton. Initial contacts with native peoples were apparently amiable and peaceful. On one occasion Fr. Cáncer knelt in prayer with his fellow missionaries and with Magdalena, and they were joined by many Indians. Fr. Tolosa and Fuentes were apprehended and killed shortly after they opted, against Fr. Cáncer's judgment, to separate themselves from the rest of the missionary party and travel on foot to their destined port. Their deaths were later confirmed by a Spaniard named Muñoz, who had come to Florida with the Soto expedition and who now sought refuge with the Dominicans. Some time later Fr. Cáncer went ashore and was clubbed to death after having fallen to his knees in prayer. The location of these killings was most likely present-day Safety Harbor, Florida.

These Dominican missionaries have enjoyed a continuous fama (reputation for martyrdom) from an early date. A remarkable relic is the diary that Fr. Cáncer kept in his own hand, which was completed by Fr. Beteta, an eyewitness to his death.

#### 4) Fr. Pedro Martínez, S.J. (between September 28 and October 6, 1566)

Fr. Pedro Martínez, a native of Teruel in Aragón, was appointed Superior of the first band of Jesuits bound for Florida, who departed Spain in June of 1566. With him were two fellow Jesuits, Fr. Juan Rogel and Br. Francisco Vilareal. When their ship was near the coast of Florida, Fr. Martínez volunteered to take a small party ashore in a smaller boat in order to seek directions and supplies. On September 14, 1566 they made landfall, perhaps on Cumberland Island. As they traveled through native villages they were well received until they entered a region under the control of Saturiba, who was partial to the Huguenots. Near present-day Mount Cornelia, on the eastern outskirts of Jacksonville, Fr. Martínez's companions went ashore in search of fish, leaving him and the remaining crew in their boat, which was soon surrounded. Not availing himself of an opportunity to escape, Fr. Martínez was eventually pulled from the boat, dragged ashore, and beaten to death. He has long been regarded as the proto-Jesuit martyr of the Americas.

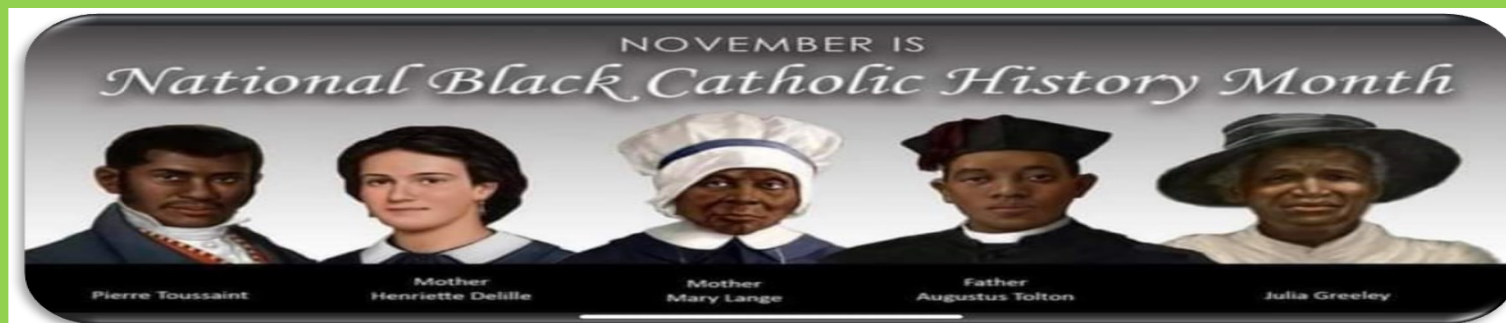

These eight Jesuit missionaries were killed in February 1571 in present-day Virginia, which at the time was claimed by the Spanish and was part of La Florida. In the summer of 1570, frustrated with the slow progress of evangelization in the Spanish forts ringing the peninsula of Florida, Fr. Juan Bautista de Segura, a native of Toledo, opted to undertake a mission far to the north to a region known as Ajacán. Apart from the long-standing Spanish interest in this region, Fr. Segura was attracted to this location by an Indian named Paquiquineo, a native of Ajacán, who had received baptism while in Mexico City, having taken the name Luis, and was now offering to assist the Spanish in the conversion of his tribe. *We* will continue next week. Not many people know that King Nzinga-a-Nkuwu Mbemba (Afonso the Good) of the Kongo and his subjects made their profession of faith thanks to the work of Portuguese missionaries one year before Christopher Columbus made his famous voyage in 1492, or that Pope Leo X consecrated the king's son, Henrique, Titular Bishop of Utica in 1518 which was one year before Martin Luther nailed his list of ninety-five theses to the Church in Wittenberg. Bishop Henrique was the first native bishop of West Africa. However, he died in 1531. The Congolese Church and the hopes for an indigenous clergy died with him. Finally, the genocidal slave trade killed true evangelization in sub-Saharan Africa for several centuries.

Notwithstanding the moral crimes of chattel slavery, the French and Spanish missionaries ministered to their free and enslaved African population within their respective colonies. This ministry laid the foundation for Black Catholic communities within the United States, i.e. Mobile, Alabama; New Orleans, Louisiana; and Saint Augustine, Florida. It is important to note that many African-American Catholics cherish a certain Peruvian Dominican, Saint Martin de Porres, the only Black Saint from the Western Hemisphere to date.

Tragically, the American Catholic Church did not seriously commit its time and resources to minister to the African-American population during the ante-bellum or post-bellum periods. However, God made a way!!! In spite of insuperable obstacles and opposition, African-American Catholics created a remarkable movement of faith and evangelization. Many courageous people played pivotal roles within church history like Mother Mary Elizabeth Lange, Mathilda Beasley, Daniel Rudd, and the Reverend Augustus Tolton. They witnessed their faith, ministered to their people, and left lasting legacies in the face of prejudice, ignorance, and indifference. One cannot read their stories without feeling tremendous joy, sorrow, and inspiration. They are truly heroic accounts!

Black History Month provides opportunities to learn and share the whole history and rich heritage of Christian Catholicism. Ubi Victoria Veritas! The Victory of Truth!

No mucha gente sabe que el rey Nzinga-a-Nkuwu Mbemba (Afonso el Bueno) del Congo y sus súbditos hicieron su profesión de fe gracias al trabajo de los misioneros portugueses un año antes de que Cristóbal Colón hiciera su famoso viaje en 1492, o que el Papa León X consagró al hijo del rey, Henrique, obispo titular de Utica en 1518, un año antes de que Martín Lutero clavara su lista de noventa y cinco tesis en la Iglesia de Wittenberg. El obispo Henrique fue el primer obispo nativo de África occidental. Sin embargo, murió en 1531. La Iglesia congoleña y las esperanzas de un clero indígena murieron con él. Finalmente, la trata genocida de esclavos acabó con la verdadera evangelización en el África subsahariana durante varios siglos.

A pesar de los crímenes morales de la esclavitud, los misioneros franceses y españoles ministraron a su población africana libre y esclavizada dentro de sus respectivas colonias. Este ministerio sentó las bases para las comunidades católicas negras dentro de los Estados Unidos, es decir, Mobile, Alabama; Nueva Orleans, Louisiana; y San Agustín, Florida. Es importante señalar que muchos católicos afroamericanos aprecian a cierto dominico peruano, San Martín de Porres, el único santo negro del hemisferio occidental hasta la fecha.

Trágicamente, la Iglesia católica estadounidense no comprometió seriamente su tiempo y recursos para ministrar a la población afroamericana durante los períodos anterior y posterior a la guerra. ¡¡¡Sin embargo, Dios abrió un camino!!! A pesar de obstáculos y oposición insuperables, los católicos afroamericanos crearon un notable movimiento de fe y evangelización. Muchas personas valientes desempeñaron papeles fundamentales en la historia de la iglesia, como la Madre Mary Elizabeth Lange, Mathilda Beasley, Daniel Rudd y el Reverendo Augustus Tolton. Fueron testigos de su fe, ministraron a su pueblo y dejaron legados duraderos frente al prejuicio, la ignorancia y la indiferencia. No se pueden leer sus historias sin sentir una enorme alegría, tristeza e inspiración. ¡Son relatos verdaderamente heroicos!

**P.** La expedición de Cáncer avistó la costa de Florida aproximadamente a 27° de latitud, en algún lugar cerca de la actual Bradenton. Cáncer se arrodilló en oración con sus compañeros misioneros y con Magdalena, y a ellos se unieron muchos indios. P. Tolosa y Fuentes fueron aprehendidos y asesinados poco después de optar, contra el P. A criterio de Cáncer, separarse del resto del grupo misionero y viajar a pie hasta el puerto de destino. Sus muertes fueron confirmadas más tarde por un español llamado Muñoz, que había llegado a Florida con la expedición de Soto y que ahora buscaba refugio con los dominicos. Algún tiempo después el P. Cáncer desembarcó y murió apaleado después de haber caído de rodillas en oración. Lo más probable es que el lugar de estos asesinatos fuera el actual Safety Harbor, Florida. Estos misioneros dominicos han disfrutado de una continua fama (reputación de martirio) desde una fecha temprana. Una reliquia notable es el diario que escribió el P. Cáncer conservaba en su propia mano, que fue completada por el P. Beteta, testigo presencial de su muerte.

4) P. Pedro Martínez, S.J. (entre el 28 de septiembre y el 6 de octubre de 1566) P. Pedro Martínez, natural de Teruel en Aragón, fue nombrado Superior del primer grupo de jesuitas con destino a Florida, que partió de España en junio de 1566. Con él estaban dos compañeros jesuitas, el P. Juan Rogel y fr. Francisco Villareal. Cuando su barco estaba cerca de la costa de Florida, el P. Martínez se ofreció a llevar a un pequeño grupo a tierra en un bote más pequeño para buscar direcciones y suministros. El 14 de septiembre de 1566 tocaron tierra, quizás en la isla Cumberland. Mientras viajaban a través de pueblos nativos fueron bien recibidos hasta que entraron en una región bajo el control de Saturiba, que era partidario de los hugonotes. Cerca del actual Monte Cornelia, en las afueras del este de Jacksonville, el P. Los compañeros de Martínez desembarcaron en busca de pescado, dejándolo a él y al resto de la tripulación en su barco, que pronto fue rodeado. Sin aprovechar la oportunidad de escapar, el P. Martínez finalmente fue sacado del barco, arrastrado a tierra y asesinado a golpes. Durante mucho tiempo se le ha considerado el mártir protojesuita de América.

Estos ocho misioneros jesuitas fueron asesinados en febrero de 1571 en la actual Virginia, que en ese momento era reclamada por los españoles y formaba parte de La Florida. En el verano de 1570, frustrado por el lento progreso de la evangelización en los fuertes españoles que rodeaban la península de Florida, el P. Juan Bautista de Segura, natural de Toledo, optó por emprender una misión muy al norte, en una región conocida como Ajacán. Aparte del interés español de larga data en esta región, el P. Segura fue atraído a este lugar por un indio llamado Paquiquineo, natural de Ajacán, que había recibido el bautismo mientras estaba en la Ciudad de México, habiendo tomado el nombre de Luis, y ahora se ofrecía para ayudar a los españoles en la conversión de su tribu. 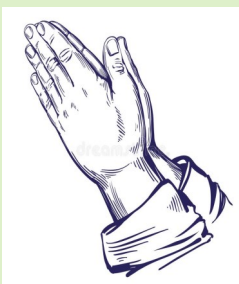

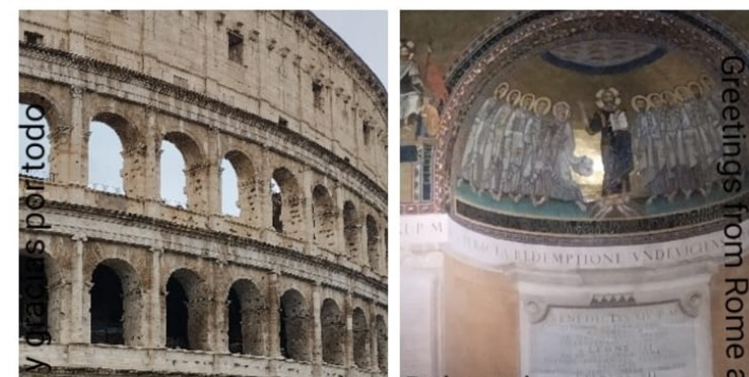
