**From the Pastor's Desk...**

**Sunday, November 19th, 2023 – Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time - Cycle A**  
**Readings:** Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31, **Psalm 128 “Blessed are those who fear the Lord”**, 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6, Matthew 25: 14-30

**The Martyrs of la Florida**

The eight Jesuits, accompanied by a young altar-server named Alonso Olmos, the son of settlers of Santa Elena, arrived in Ajacán in early September 1570. Paquiquineo/Don Luis remained with the Jesuits for only a few days; he soon returned to live with his tribe, and he rejected more than one entreaty by the Jesuits to return. Five months later he and some companions attacked the Jesuits on two separate occasions, killing them all. Only Alonso survived. These eight Jesuits have enjoyed a reputation for martyrdom from an early date.

At least as early as 1607 it was reported that several villages in Apalachee—the region of northern Florida between the Aucilla and Ochlockonee Rivers—were requesting friars, but it was not until 1633 that the Spanish established a permanent missionary presence there. Initial reports indicated widespread conversions to Christianity, and by 1647 eight native chiefs (out of more than forty) had converted and had permitted the establishment of doctrinas in their villages. But in early 1647 Apalachee was the scene of a brutal uprising.

The planned revolt began on the evening of February 14 in the newly-established mission of San Antonio de Bacuqua, where a large crowd, including the Florencia family, had assembled to celebrate the following day’s feast of the translation of the relics of St. Anthony. Five friars managed to escape with the help of Christian natives. Six Spanish soldiers also survived because they were at Governor Ruíz’s wheat farm at the time. But three friars were killed, as were the Lieutenant Governor and several members of his family. Seven of the eight churches in the region were burned. Regrettably, few of the names of those who were killed have survived. In addition to Ensign Claudio Luis de Florencia (b. 1597), who had been appointed Lieutenant Governor of Apalachee in April 1645, and his wife Juana de Leiva y Arteaga (b. 1598), we only know the names of two of their daughters: Antonia (b. 1632) and Maria (b. 1628). We know, however, that Maria’s infant son was killed, and we also know that her unborn child was killed, brutally cut from her womb. We also know that Antonia was particularly courageous and demonstrative in her testimony of faith. In retaliation for her proclamation of the “Law of God,” she was tied to a pillar of the bell tower of the church and her breasts and tongue were cut off. The bodies of the slain were tossed into a lake. They were discovered once the rebellion had been put down.

**Los martires de la Florida**

Los ocho jesuitas, acompañados por un joven monaguillo llamado Alonso Olmos, hijo de colonos de Santa Elena, llegaron a Ajacán a principios de septiembre de 1570. Paquiquineo/Don Luis permaneció con los jesuitas sólo unos días; Pronto regresó a vivir con su tribu y rechazó más de una súplica de los jesuitas para regresar. Cinco meses después, él y algunos compañeros atacaron a los jesuitas en dos ocasiones distintas, matándolos a todos. Sólo Alonso sobrevivió. Estos ocho jesuitas han gozado de fama de martirio desde una fecha temprana.

Al menos ya en 1607 se informó que varias aldeas de Apalachee (la región del norte de Florida entre los ríos Aucilla y Ochlockonee) solicitaban frailes, pero no fue hasta 1633 que los españoles establecieron una presencia misionera permanente allí. Los informes iniciales indicaron conversiones generalizadas al cristianismo y, en 1647, ocho jefes nativos (de más de cuarenta) se habían convertido y habían permitido el establecimiento de doctrinas en sus aldeas. Pero a principios de 1647, Apalachee fue escenario de un levantamiento brutal. La revuelta planeada comenzó la tarde del 14 de febrero en la recién establecida misión de San Antonio de Bacuqua, donde una gran multitud, incluida la familia Florencia, se había reunido para celebrar la fiesta del día siguiente de la traducción de las reliquias de San Antonio. Cinco frailes lograron escapar con la ayuda de nativos cristianos. Seis soldados españoles también sobrevivieron porque se encontraban en ese momento en la finca de trigo del gobernador Ruíz. Pero murieron tres frailes, así como el vicegobernador y varios miembros de su familia. Siete de las ocho iglesias de la región fueron quemadas. Lamentablemente, pocos de los nombres de los asesinados han sobrevivido. Además del alférez Claudio Luis de Florencia (n. 1597), quien había sido nombrado vicegobernador de Apalachee en abril de 1645, y su esposa Juana de Leiva y Arteaga (n. 1598), sólo conocemos los nombres de dos de sus hijas. : Antonia (n. 1632) y María (n. 1628). Sabemos, sin embargo, que el hijo pequeño de María fue asesinado, y también sabemos que su hijo no nacido fue asesinado, brutalmente arrancado de su vientre. Sabemos también que Antonia fue particularmente valiente y demostrativa en su testimonio de fe. En represalia por su proclamación de la "Ley de Dios", la ataron a un pilar del campanario de la iglesia y le cortaron los senos y la lengua. Los cuerpos de los asesinados fueron arrojados a un lago. Fueron descubiertos una vez sofocada la rebelión.

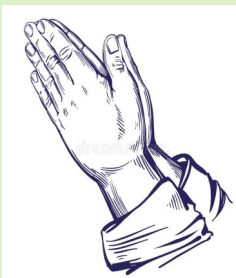
