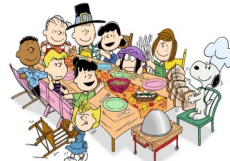

From the Pastor's Desk...

Sunday, November 5th, 2023 – Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time - Cycle A

Readings: Malachi 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10, **Psalm 131** “In you, Lord, I have found my peace”, 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13, Matthew 23:1-12

The Martyrs of la Florida

“Nevertheless, our labor has not been in vain. A large part of the work has been done, especially the foundation built, and time, I am sure, will bring the glory we seek. If the result doesn't come while we are still on earth, there may be an added joy and interest in watching the mortals work out an answer to the problem from the blissful skies above.” — Bishop John Mark Gannon, in a Christmas card in 1941, shortly after he had submitted to Rome materials for the beatification of the Martyrs of the United States.

In recent years the Committee for the Cause of the Beatification of the Martyrs of La Florida has been working to fulfill Bishop Gannon's prophecy. A significant step was taken on October 12, 2015, when Bishop Gregory L. Parkes formally opened the beatification cause at an outdoor Mass in Tallahassee.

Since that time, members of the Historical Commission have been extensively reseing numerous individuals from the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth centuries who are reported to have died for the faith within the land that was once known as La Florida. These investigations have taken members of the Historical Commission to archives in Florida, Georgia, Missouri, and Louisiana, as well as Cuba, Mexico, Spain, and Rome. In keeping with the Church's prudent requirements, the Historical Commission has rigorously examined each and every report of martyrdom in order to assess its accuracy and credibility. Of the many accounts of martyrdom that have been studied, several have been determined to be reliable enough to submit to the scrutiny of the Church, while others that are not as well attested have been deemed to require further study and verification.

On February 14, 2022 Bishop William A. Wack of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee submitted to Rome a list of those individuals for whom credible evidence of martyrdom exists. The Congregation for the Causes of Saints has received this list, and we are awaiting further direction from them.

The individuals on this list are: 1)Fr. Diego de Tolosa, O.P. (early June, 1549)

2) Br. Fuentes, O.P. (early June, 1549)

3) Fr. Luis de Cáncer, O.P. (June 26, 1549)

Fr. Cáncer, a native of Barbastro, in the Kingdom of Aragón, joined the Dominican order and spent many years ministering in the Caribbean and Central America. Having heard reports of unsuccessful Spanish missions to Florida and having encountered native Floridians who had been dispossessed as a result of Spanish activity there, Fr. Cáncer and his fellow Dominican Fr. Gregorio de Beteta resolved to “plant the Gospel in the land of Florida.”

In the late spring of 1549 Fr. Cáncer and Fr. Beteta left Veracruz on the Santa María de la Encina bound for Havana and then Florida. With them were the Dominican priests Juan Garcia and Diego de Tolosa and a lay brother named Fuentes. Once in Havana the missionaries received further supplies, and they were also joined by a Christian Indian named Magdalena (or Madalena) who was to serve as their translator. Magdalena, a member of the Tocobaga tribe, had been captured by the Spanish in 1539 during the Soto expedition. On the Vigil of the Ascension (Wednesday, May 5, 1549). We will continue next week. On July 24, 1990, the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States designated November as Black Catholic History Month to celebrate the long history and proud heritage of Black Catholics. Two commemorative dates fall within this month, Saint Augustine's Birthday (November 13) and Saint Martin de Porres' Feast Day (November 3). More importantly, November not only marks a time when we pray for all saints and souls in loving remembrance, but also a time to recall the saints and souls of Africa and the African Diaspora.

Some people forget that Christianity did not originate in Europe and even express surprise when they learn that Black Catholic History began in the Acts of the Apostles (8: 26-40) with the conversion of the Ethiopian Eunuch by Philip the Deacon. This text is important for several reasons. First, it chronicles the conversion of the first Black African in recorded Christian history. Second, the text suggests that the man was a wealthy, literate, and powerful emissary of the Nubian Queen and also a faithful, practicing Jew prior to his baptism. Clearly, he was not an ignorant heathen. Third, the Ethiopian Eunuch's conversion predates the conversions of Saints Paul and Cornelius. Most significantly, many cite this conversion as the very moment when the church changed from a Hebrew and Hellenist community to the truly Universal and Catholic Church.

Black Catholics trace their faith history back to Christian antiquity long before other nations heard the “Good News.” Christian Africa was indeed a “leading light” in early Christendom. Black Catholics point to three popes who were born in Africa: Saints Victor I, Melchisedech, and Gelasius I. All three shepherded the early church through tough and tumultuous times in history. Black Catholics claim many Black Saints like Saints Cyprian, Zeno, Anthony of Egypt, Moses the Black, Pachomius, Maurice, Athanasius, Pistentius, Mary of Egypt, Cyril of Alexandria, Monica of Hippo, Augustine of Hippo, Perpetua, Felicitas, and Thecla. Some of these mystics, monastics, and martyrs literally made the church what it is today.

El 24 de julio de 1990, el Caucus Nacional del Clero Católico de Raza Negra de los Estados Unidos designó noviembre como el Mes de la Historia Católica de la Raza Negra para celebrar la larga historia y la orgullosa herencia de los católicos afroamericanos. Dentro de este mes caen dos fechas conmemorativas, el cumpleaños de San Agustín (13 de noviembre) y la fiesta de San Martín de Porres (3 de noviembre). Más importante aún, noviembre no sólo marca un momento en el que oramos por todos los santos y las almas en amoroso recuerdo, sino también un momento para recordar a los santos y las almas de África y la diáspora africana.

Algunas personas olvidan que el cristianismo no se originó en Europa e incluso se sorprenden cuando se enteran de que la historia católica Africana comenzó en los Hechos de los Apóstoles (8: 26-40) con la conversión del eunuco etíope por parte de Felipe el Diácono. Este texto es importante por varias razones. En primer lugar, narra la conversión del primer africano de raza negra de la historia cristiana registrada. En segundo lugar, el texto sugiere que el hombre era un emisario rico, alfabetizado y poderoso de la reina de Nubia y también un judío fiel y practicante antes de su bautismo. Claramente, él no era un pagano ignorante. En tercer lugar, la conversión del eunuco etíope es anterior a las conversiones de los santos Pablo y Cornelio. Lo más significativo es que muchos citan esta conversión como el momento preciso en que la Iglesia pasó de ser una comunidad hebrea y helenista a ser una Iglesia verdaderamente universal y católica. La historia de los católicos de raza negra remontan de fe a la antigüedad cristiana mucho antes de que otras naciones escucharan las “Buenas Nuevas”. El Africa cristiana fue de hecho una “luz guía” en la cristiandad primitiva.

Los católicos de raza negra señalan a tres papas que nacieron en África: los santos Víctor I, Melquíades y Gelasio I. Los tres pastorearon a la iglesia primitiva a través de tiempos difíciles y tumultuosos de la historia. Los católicos negros afirman que hay muchos santos negros como los santos Cipriano, Zenón, Antonio de Egipto, Moisés el Negro, Pacomio, Mauricio, Atanasio, Pisencio, María de Egipto, Cirilo de Alejandría, Mónica de Hipona, Agustín de Hipona, Perpetua, Felicitas y Tecla. . Algunos de estos místicos, monjes y mártires literalmente hicieron de la iglesia lo que es hoy.

Domingo, 5 de noviembre de 2023 - XXXI domingo de tiempo ordinario - Ciclo A

Los mártires de la Florida “Sin embargo, nuestro trabajo no ha sido en vano. Gran parte del trabajo ya está hecho, especialmente los cimientos construidos, y el tiempo, estoy seguro, traerá la gloria que buscamos. Si el resultado no llega mientras todavía estamos en la Tierra, puede haber mayor alegría e interés al ver a los mortales encontrar una respuesta al problema desde los dichosos cielos”. —Obispo John Mark Gannon, en una tarjeta navideña de 1941, poco después de haber enviado a Roma materiales para la beatificación de los mártires de los Estados Unidos.

En los últimos años el Comité para la Causa de Beatificación de los Mártires de La Florida ha estado trabajando para cumplir la profecía del obispo Gannon. Se dio un paso significativo el 12 de octubre de 2015, cuando el obispo Gregory L. Parkes inauguró formalmente la causa de beatificación en una misa al aire libre en Tallahassee.

Desde entonces, los miembros de la Comisión Histórica han estado investigando extensamente a numerosos individuos de los siglos XVI, XVII y XVIII que, según se informa, murieron por la fe dentro de la tierra que una vez fue conocida como La Florida. Estas investigaciones han llevado a miembros de la Comisión Histórica a archivos de Florida, Georgia, Missouri y Luisiana, así como a Cuba, México, España y Roma. De acuerdo con los prudentes requisitos de la Iglesia, la Comisión Histórica ha examinado rigurosamente todos y cada uno de los informes de martirio para evaluar su exactitud y credibilidad. De los muchos relatos de martirio que se han estudiado, se ha determinado que varios son lo suficientemente confiables como para someterse al escrutinio de la Iglesia, mientras que se considera que otros que no están tan bien atestiguados requieren más estudio y verificación.

El 14 de febrero de 2022, el obispo William A. Wack de la Diócesis de Pensacola-Tallahassee presentó a Roma una lista de aquellas personas de las que existe evidencia creíble de martirio. La Congregación para las Causas de los Santos ha recibido esta lista y estamos esperando más instrucciones de su parte. Las personas en esta lista son:

- 1) Fr. Diego de Tolosa, O.P. (principios de junio de 1549)
- 2) Hno. Fuentes, O.P. (principios de junio de 1549)
- 3) P. Luis de Cáncer, O.P. (26 de junio de 1549)

P. Cáncer, natural de Barbastro, en el Reino de Aragón, se unió a la orden dominicana y pasó muchos años ministrando en el Caribe y Centroamérica. Habiendo escuchado informes de misiones españolas fallidas en Florida y habiendo encontrado nativos de Florida que habían sido desposeídos como resultado de la actividad española allí, el P. Cáncer y su compañero dominico p. Gregorio de Beteta resolvió “plantar el Evangelio en la tierra de Florida”. A finales de la primavera de 1549 el P. Cáncer y el P. Beteta salió de Veracruz en el Santa María de la Encina con destino a La Habana y luego a Florida. Con ellos estaban los sacerdotes dominicos Juan García y Diego de Tolosa y un hermano laico llamado Fuentes. Una vez en La Habana, los misioneros recibieron más suministros y también se les unió una india cristiana llamada Magdalena (o Madalena) que les serviría como traductora. Magdalena, miembro de la tribu Tocobaga, había sido capturada por los españoles en 1539 durante la expedición de Soto. Sobre la Vigilia de la Ascensión (miércoles 5 de mayo de 1549).

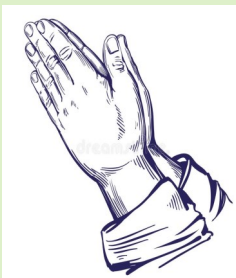

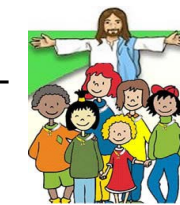
