Sunday, October 1st, 2023 – Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Cycle A
Readings: Ezequiel 18:25-28, Psalm 25 “Remember your mercies, O Lord”, Philippians 2:1-11, Matthew 21:28-32

GOOD ACTIONS SHOW LOVE

Brothers and sisters

1. It is tough to obey God’s demands because they are often difficult and unexpected. We often lose interest in religious practices when we acquire human securities and material goods. How often we find Christians that act like those Pharisees! They place their security in nonessential practices and at the same time reject certain contents of the faith or disagree with the moral norms of the Church. Devotions such as novenas, pilgrimages to holy sites, public penances, the use of sacred images, songs and expressions of joy or sorrow, etc., only have meaning if they are accompanied by conversion, a conversion expressed in serving others and obeying the Commandments.

The parable of the two sons is direct and to the point. “A father had two sons.” The difference between the two brothers can be paralleled to two prominent attitudes of ancient Israel: those who considered themselves as good people who didn’t need conversion, and those who knew that they were sinners and wanted to change. It was clear to the Pharisees that Christ was referring to them because they “only paid lip service”. They remembered Jesus’ saying: “Not everyone who cries out ‘Lord, Lord’ will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father”.

2. In the parable, the father gives his sons the command “Go work in the vineyard.” Every day it is more and more urgent for Christians to be witnesses of Christ in the midst of a secular, relativistic world. Evil is everywhere, yet it only takes a little yeast to ferment dough, a little salt to preserve meat, and a small flock to preserve the faith. St. James never tired of repeating that “faith without works is dead,” and we always hear that “the heart has reasons that the mind doesn’t know.”

What will we be asked on the judgment day? Saint Paul says “God will repay each one according to his deeds.” And Saint Peter Chrysologus adds that “incoherence is a subtle evil, a secret infection, a hidden poison.” All too often we hear: “I’m Catholic, but not practicing”.

3. Sometimes I ask good Christians if they are practicing their faith and they tell me, “Of course. I go to Mass every Sunday”. But what about the other Sacraments? Take a look at your life. Do you fulfill all the Commandments? Do you do works of mercy? Do you help others? Do you think about the salvation of your soul? Do you pray? Do you give others a good example of Christian life? Are you perhaps committing sins of omission? The Gospel gives a clear standard of coherence: “If you love me you will keep my Commandments.”

Today let us decide to continue the revolution that Christ brought to the world: the revolution of love. In Christ’s eyes, the just person isn’t the one who fulfills the exterior law, but rather the one who is capable of freeing himself from human attachments and securities. Let us predispose our hearts towards God in the same way as St. Teresa of Jesus: “I am yours. I was made for you. What do you wish me to do?”

3. Mons. Luis Rueda Aparicio, Arzobispo de Bogotá (Colombia)

Mons. Luis José Rueda Aparicio, de 61 años, nació en San Gil (Santander, Colombia) el 3 de marzo de 1962.

Antes de ingresar al Seminario encontró trabajo junto a su padre, Luis Emilio Aparicio, en el mundo de la construcción. También vendió periódicos y colaboró con un programa deportivo de la emisora Armonías de San Gil en 1981. El 31 de enero de 1983 inició sus estudios de Filosofía en el Seminario Conciliar San Carlos de San Gil y los estudios de Teología los realizó en el Seminario Arquidiocesano de Bucaramanga, desde 1986 hasta 1989. En 1994 obtuvo el título de Licenciado en Teología Moral en la Academia Alfonsiana de Roma.

El 2 de febrero de 2012, Benedicto XVI lo nombró obispo de Montelíbano (Córdoba). Recibió la Ordenación Episcopal en la Catedral de San Gil, el 14 de abril de 2012 y tomó posesión canónica de la diócesis de Montelíbano el 28 de abril de 2012. El 19 de mayo de 2018, el Papa Francisco lo nombró Arzobispo de Popayán (Cauca, Colombia). Fue nombrado Arzobispo metropolitano de Bogotá el 25 de abril de 2020 por el Papa Francisco.

Desde el 13 de mayo de 2021 hasta el 25 de junio de 2022, fue Administrador Apostólico de la Diócesis de Soacha (Cundinamarca). El 6 de julio de 2021 fue elegido como Presidente de la Conferencia Episcopal de Colombia, cargo que ocupará hasta 2024.



4. Mons. Diego Rafael Padrón Sánchez, Arzobispo Emérito de Cumaná (Venezuela)

Mons. Padrón Sánchez se convertirá en uno de los 3 cardenales sin derecho a voto en un futuro cónclave, ya que el pasado 17 de mayo cumplió 84 años.

Fue ordenado sacerdote en 1963 en la Iglesia Parroquial Inmaculada Concepción de Montalbán, Carabobo (Venezuela).

El futuro purpurado fue presidente de la Conferencia Episcopal de Venezuela desde 2012 hasta 2015.

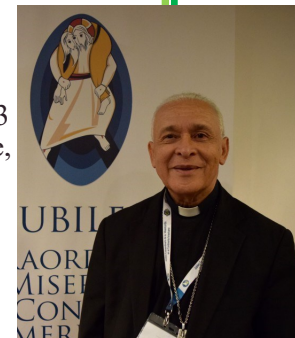
Estudió en el Seminario Menor de Valencia (Venezuela) y obtuvo el título de bachiller en Filosofía y Letras en el Seminario Interdiocesano Santa Rosa de Lima de Caracas.

Obtuvo la Licenciatura de Teología Bíblica en la Pontificia Universidad Gregoriana de Roma, con Diplomado en Ciencias Bíblicas Orientales en el Instituto Franciscanum de Jerusalén (Israel). También presidió el Departamento de Catequesis del Consejo Episcopal Latinoamericano (CELAM).

San Juan Pablo II lo nombró Obispo Auxiliar de la Arquidiócesis de Caracas y Obispo titular de Gisipa. El 27 de mayo de 2002, el Papa santo también lo nombró II Arzobispo Metropolitano de la Arquidiócesis de Cumaná, cargo que tuvo hasta el 24 de mayo de 2018.

3. Bishop Luis Rueda Aparicio, Archbishop of Bogotá (Colombia)

Mons. Luis José Rueda Aparicio, 61 years old, was born in San Gil (Santander, Colombia) on March 3, 1962. Before entering the Seminary he worked alongside his father, Luis Emilio Aparicio, in the world of construction. He also sold newspapers and collaborated with a sports program on the Armonías de San Gil station in 1981. On January 31, 1983, he began his studies in Philosophy at the San Carlos de San Gil Conciliar Seminary and studied Theology at the Archdiocesan Seminary of Bucaramanga, from

1986 to 1989. In 1994 he obtained the title of Bachelor of Moral Theology in the Alphonsian Academy in Rome.

On February 2, 2012, Benedict XVI appointed him bishop of Montelíbano (Córdoba). He received Episcopal Ordination in the Cathedral of San Gil on April 14, 2012 and took canonical possession of the diocese of Montelíbano on April 28, 2012. On May 19, 2018, Pope Francis appointed him Archbishop of Popayán (Cauca, Colombia). He was named Metropolitan Archbishop of Bogotá on April 25, 2020 by Pope Francis.

From May 13, 2021 to June 25, 2022, he was Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Soacha (Cundinamarca). On July 6, 2021 he was elected President of the Episcopal Conference of Colombia, a position he will hold until 2024.

4. Bishop Diego Rafael Padrón Sánchez, Archbishop Emeritus of Cumaná (Venezuela)

Mons. Padrón Sánchez became one of the 3 cardinals without the right to vote in a future conclave, since on May 17 he turned 84 years old. He was ordained a priest in 1963 at the Inmaculada Concepción Parish Church of Montalbán, Carabobo (Venezuela).

The future cardinal was president of the Episcopal Conference of Venezuela from 2012 to 2015. He studied at the Minor Seminary of Valencia (Venezuela) and obtained a bachelor's degree in Philosophy and Letters at the Santa Rosa de Lima Inter-

diocesan Seminary in Caracas. He obtained a Licentiate in Biblical Theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, with a Diploma in Oriental Biblical Sciences at the Franciscanum Institute in Jerusalem (Israel). He also chaired the Department of Catechesis of the Latin American Episcopal Council (CELAM).

Saint John Paul II appointed him Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Caracas and Titular Bishop of Gisipa. On May 27, 2002, the Holy Pope also appointed him II Metropolitan Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Cumaná, a position he held until May 24, 2018.

Palabras del Párroco

Domingo, 1 de octubre de 2023 - XXVI domingo de tiempo ordinario - Ciclo A

Lecturas: Ezequiel 18, 25-28, Salmo 24 "Descúbrenos, Señor, tus caminos", Filipenses 2, 1-11, Mateo 21, 28-32

OBRAS SON AMORES

Hermanas y hermanos:

1. Obedecer a Dios implica cumplir sus exigencias, a veces duras e imprevisibles. Muchas veces nuestras prácticas religiosas pierden su valor cuando nos procuran seguridades humanas y beneficios materiales. ¡Cuántas veces encontramos cristianos que se parecen a aquellos fariseos! Ponen su seguridad en los ritos externos pero rechazan algunos contenidos de fe o están en desacuerdo con las normas morales de la Iglesia. Las devociones como el rezo de novenas, peregrinaciones a santuarios, sacrificios públicos, uso de imágenes, cantos y signos de alegría o de dolor, solamente tienen valor si van acompañadas de la conversión, la entrega a los demás y el cumplimiento de los mandamientos.

La parábola de los dos hijos es sobria, reducida a lo esencial, no hay nada superfluo. "Un padre tenía dos hijos": La diferencia entre los dos hermanos retrata dos categorías de la sociedad hebrea: Los que se creen justos y que no necesitan conversión; y los pecadores que sienten la necesidad de convertirse. Los fariseos se sintieron aludidos porque "dicen y no hacen". Se acordaron seguramente de aquel dicho de Jesús: "No el que dice ¡Señor, Señor! Entrará en el Reino de los cielos, sino el que hace la Voluntad de mi Padre".

2. El Padre de la parábola usa el verbo en imperativo: "¡Ve hoy a trabajar en la viña!". Cada día es más urgente que el cristiano actúe como un testigo de Cristo en medio de un mundo secularizado y relativista. El mal va invadiéndolo todo, sin embargo, basta un poco de levadura para fermentar la masa, basta un poco de sal para evitar la corrupción, basta una pequeña grey para conservar la fe. Santiago apóstol no se cansa de repetir: "La fe sin obras es fe muerta". A nosotros nos lo han repetido desde niños: "obras son amores y no buenas razones".

¿De qué nos van a examinar el día del juicio? Dice San Pablo que "Dios dará a cada uno según sus obras". Y San Pedro Crisólogo añade: "la incoherencia es un mal sutil, una infección secreta, un veneno escondido". ¿Acaso no se oye por ahí con frecuencia: "Soy católico pero no practicante"?

3. A veces pregunto a buenos cristianos si son "practicantes" y me responden "Naturalmente, yo voy a misa todos los domingos". Pero ¿Dónde quedan los demás sacramentos? Examínate: ¿Cumples todos los mandamientos? ¿Practicar las obras de misericordia? ¿Sirves a los demás y piensas en la salvación de tu alma? ¿Oras y das buen ejemplo? ¿No estarás cometiendo quizá pecado de omisión? El criterio de la coherencia cristiana es claro e imperativo: "Si me amáis, guardaréis mis mandamientos"

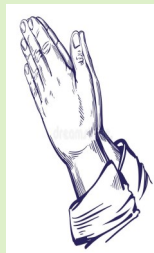
