From the Pastor's Desk...

Sunday, October 8th, 2023 – Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time - Cycle A

Readings: Isaiah 5:1-7, Psalm 80 "The vineyard of the Lord is the house of Israel", Phillipians 4:6-9, Matthew 21:33-43

WHAT KIND OF WINE GROWERS ARE WE?

Jesus explains the history of salvation for the third time in a row to the priests and Pharisees: a story of God's infinite love for his people and their stubborn unfaithfulness. Christ uses a parable to write an autobiography of his death and resurrection.

Brothers and Sisters:

1. The owner of the vineyard sent his own Son to the tenants with the hope that they would at least respect and receive him. Yet, the temptation was irresistible: "Let us kill him and acquire his inheritance". Two thousand years ago they did just that when they killed the Son of God. They couldn't put up with him, and they believed that they could silence forever his extremely inconvenient words by killing him. They believed that if they could succeed in silencing him then they could live in peace and enjoy a privileged status. However, they were mistaken, for "the stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone."

Christ extends his Kingdom on earth through the mystery of his cross and Resurrection. A new people is arising destined to bear much fruit. The Church receives the inheritance due to the people of God.

2. God continues sending messengers who call for action. The Pope, the missionaries, and the committed lay faithful are the conscience of the world through the testimony of their lives. Nonetheless, they are rejected and ignored because they don't go well with a materialistic or liberalistic way of life.

The "good men" of Israel were those who outwardly fulfilled the Covenant by going to the synagogue and saying their prayers, but who neither fulfilled the spirit of the law nor accepted Christ. And what about us? The greatest scandal of our times is Christians who live mediocre and comfortable lives. They are the real enemy of the faith and the Church, since they undermine it from within its own ranks.

3. In a certain sense, we all make up part of the band of murderous vineyard workers. We have killed the Son of God, and find ourselves in a world that sees thousands of men and women dying of hunger and thousands of children who never reach adulthood. We find ourselves amidst juvenile corruption and the exploitation of women. We encounter astrologers and magicians who say that they can tell the future through the constellations. This is the inheritance of a world which insists upon killing the Son of God.

What would happen if we recovered the inheritance of the Son? His inheritance is aimed at happiness and the human person achieving fulfillment on the natural and spiritual levels. If only we could revive the image of Christ and faithfully transmit him to others through the testimony of our lives, then it is very likely that those around us would also take on the commitment to live a new lifestyle as children of God.

Brothers and Sisters, this parable was written for us. Is our behavior like that of the murderous tenants? Are we neglectful, unfaithful, barren workers who thwart the plans of God? Do we truly believe in Jesus Christ, accepting and making his ways our own? In the Eucharist, we celebrate the life of the Risen Christ, the "True Vine" that bore much fruit for his Father. Moreover, from this abundant harvest he has also made wine for us, so that we may drink it and then bear much fruit in him. Let us receive him fervently in Holy Communion. Amen.

Mes de la Herencia Hispana

5 nuevos cardenales de América Latina que el Papa creará en septiembre

Parte III

5. P. Luis Pascual Dri, confesor en el Santuario de Nuestra Señora de Pompeya, Buenos Aires (Argentina)

La púrpura de Mons. Luis Pascual Dri es quizá la más peculiar de todas. Se trata de un fraile franciscano de 96 años que desde 2007, tras su jubilación, es confesor en el Santuario de Nuestra Señora de Pompeya, en Buenos Aires.

Tal y como se recoge en Vatican News, este capuchino, nacido en Federación (Argentina) el 17 de abril de 1927, ha sido nombrado por el Papa Francisco en más de una ocasión como ejemplo de Misericordia en varias homilias y en alguna catequesis de sus audiencias generales.

El Santo Padre suele contar que, cuando era Arzobispo de Buenos Aires, este capuchino fue a su encuentro y le pidió consejo: "Te pido ayuda, tengo siempre tanta gente delante del confesionario, gente de todo tipo, humildes y menos humildes, pero también muchos sacerdotes.... Perdono mucho y a veces me viene un escrúpulo, el escrúpulo de haber perdonado demasiado".

El fraile contó a Francisco que delante del Sagrario solía decirle a Jesús: "Señor, perdóname porque he perdonado demasiado. ¡Pero fuiste tú quien me dio el mal ejemplo!". El Papa Francisco suele destacar esta anécdota para mostrar la disposición que deben de tener los sacerdotes de hoy en día a la hora de confesar a los fieles.

Mons. Roberto Francis Prevost y Mons.Christophe Louis Pierre

Entre los nuevos nombramientos se encuentra también el de Mons. Roberto Francis Prevost, Prefecto de la Congregación para los Obispos desde enero de 2023.

A pesar de haber nacido en Chicago (Estados Unidos), **ha mantenido una estrecha relación con la Iglesia en América Latina**. Ha sido Obispo de Chiclayo (Perú), vicepresidente de la Conferencia Episcopal Peruana y es el actual presidente de la Pontificia Comisión para América Latina (CAL).

Nació el 14 de septiembre de 1955 en Chicago, en el estado de Illinois (Estados Unidos). Fue ordenado sacerdote agustino en Roma el 19 de julio de 1982.

Por su parte, cabe destacar que el futuro purpurado **Mons. Christophe Louis Pierre**, Nuncio en Estados Unidos y de nacionalidad francesa, también conoce de cerca la realidad latinoamericana, pues fue Nuncio Apostólico en México desde 2007 hasta el 12 de abril de 2016.

5. Fr. Luis Pascual Dri, confessor at the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Pompeii, Buenos Aires (Argentina).

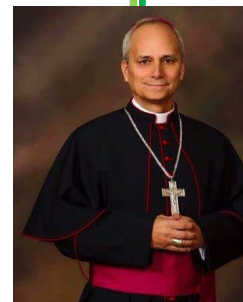


The purple of Mons. Luis Pascual Dri is perhaps the most peculiar of all. He is a 96-year-old Franciscan friar who since 2007, after his retirement, has been a confessor at the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Pompeya, in Buenos Aires.

As reported in Vatican News, this Capuchin, born in Federación (Argentina) on April 17, 1927, has been named by Pope Francis on more than one occasion as an example of Mercy in several homilies and in some catechesis of his general audiences.

The Holy Father often tells that, when he was Archbishop of Buenos Aires, this Capuchin went to meet him and asked him for advice: "I ask you for help, I always have so many people in front of the confessional, people of all kinds, humble and less humble, but also many priests.... I forgive a lot and sometimes a scruple comes to me, the scruple of having forgiven too much". The friar told Francis that in front of the Tabernacle he used to say to Jesus: "Lord, forgive me because I have forgiven too much. But it was you who gave me a bad example!" Pope Francis usually highlights this anecdote to show the disposition that today's priests must have when confessing the faithful.

Bishop Roberto Francis Prevost and Bishop Christophe Louis Pierre



Among the new appointments is also that of Bishop Roberto Francis Prevost, Prefect of the Congregation for Bishops since January 2023. Despite being born in Chicago (United States), he has maintained a close relationship with the Church in Latin America. He has been Bishop of Chiclayo (Peru), vice president of the Peruvian Episcopal Conference and is the current president of the Pontifical Commission for Latin America (CAL).

He was born on September 14, 1955 in Chicago, in the state of Illinois (United States). He was ordained an Augustinian priest in Rome on July 19, 1982.

For his part, it should be noted that the future cardinal Mons. Christophe Louis Pierre, Nuncio in the United States and of French nationality, also knows the Latin American reality closely, since he was Apostolic Nuncio in Mexico from 2007 to April 12, 2016.

Palabras del Párroco

Domingo, 8 de octubre de 2023 - XXVII domingo de tiempo ordinario - Ciclo A

Lecturas: Isaías 5, 1-7, Salmo 79 "La viña del Señor es la casa de Israel", Filipenses 4, 6-9, Mateo 21, 33-43

¿QUÉ TIPO DE VIÑADORES SOMOS?

Por tercera vez consecutiva, Jesús explica a sacerdotes y fariseos la historia de la salvación: El amor infinito de Dios y la infidelidad pertinaz de su pueblo. Jesús mismo usa una parábola del Reino para escribir su autobiografía: Lo matarán y resucitará.

Hermanas y hermanos:

1. El dueño de la viña envía a su propio Hijo con la esperanza de que al menos a él lo respeten y lo acojan; pero la tentación es muy grande: "Hay que matar al hijo y quedarse con su herencia". Hace dos mil años mataron efectivamente al Hijo de Dios. No podían soportarlo. Creyeron que así silenciarían para siempre aquella Voz que les hacía sentirse profundamente incómodos. Si conseguían callarlo, podrían de nuevo vivir tranquilos, disfrutar de su privilegiada posición. Pero se equivocaron. "La piedra que desecharon se convierte en la piedra angular de la salvación". Cristo realiza la venida de su Reino por el misterio de su muerte en la cruz y su resurrección. Está naciendo un pueblo nuevo destinado a producir frutos. La Iglesia recibe la herencia del pueblo elegido.

2. Dios sigue enviando mensajeros urgiendo resultados. El Papa, los misioneros, los seglares comprometidos actúan como la conciencia de la humanidad que da testimonio con su vida. Sin embargo son rechazados o ignorados porque resultan incómodos para un esquema de vida materialista y libertina. Aquellos "hombres de bien" de Israel eran "cumplidores", conservaban externamente la Alianza, iban a la sinagoga, recitaban sus oraciones, pero no cumplían el espíritu de la ley, no aceptaron a Cristo. ¿Y nosotros? El mayor escándalo de nuestro tiempo siguen siendo los creyentes mediocres y cómodos. Ellos son el verdadero enemigo de la fe y de la Iglesia, cuando la carcomen desde dentro de sus filas.

3. En cierto sentido todos formamos parte de los viñadores homicidas. Lo hemos matado, y nos encontramos con un mundo en el que miles de hombres y mujeres mueren de hambre, miles de niños no alcanzarán la edad adulta. Nos encontramos con corrupción de menores, con mujeres explotadas. Nos encontramos con los astrólogos y los magos, a los que acude la gente para ver cómo va a influir en ellos la conjunción de los astros. Esta es la herencia que está recogiendo el mundo que se empeña en matar al Hijo.

¿Qué pasaría si lográramos recuperar la herencia del Hijo? Una herencia en la que hay un objetivo final: el hombre, su felicidad, su desarrollo pleno con todas sus posibilidades espirituales y naturales. Si pudiéramos recuperar la figura de Jesús y la transmitiéramos fielmente con el ejemplo de nuestra vida, es muy posible que los hombres asumiesen el compromiso de vivir como resucitados.

Hermanos: Esta parábola fue escrita para nosotros: ¿Nuestro comportamiento es como el de los viñadores homicidas? ¿Somos viñadores descuidados, infieles, estériles, que frustran los planes de Dios? ¿Creemos verdaderamente en Jesús, aceptando su criterio de vida como nuestro? En la Eucaristía celebramos a Jesucristo resucitado, la "verdadera vida" que supo dar frutos plenos a su Padre y que además se ha hecho vino para nosotros, para que bebiéndole aprendamos a dar frutos en Él. Vayamos a recibirlo con fervor en la comunión. Así sea.

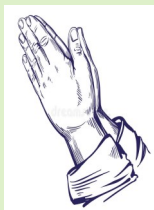
