From the Pastor's Desk...

Sunday, September 17th, 2023 – Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Cycle A
Readings: Sirach 27:30 - 28:7, Psalm 103 **“The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger, and rich in compassion.”**, Romans 14:7-9, Matthew 18:21-35

ALWAYS FORGIVE

The Our Father includes two petitions that are fundamental for the life of a Christian: *“Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us”*. Jesus answered Peter’s question about the limits of forgiveness with a parable about two hearts: the heart of the king, representing God *“rich in mercy”* who forgives and forgets all our debts; and the heart of the unjust servant who chokes his debtor without an ounce of compassion.

Sisters and brothers: if we do not take advantage of God’s mercy at the opportune time we risk hearing our condemnation at the final judgment, distancing us forever from Divine Love.

1. The first thing we must do is forgive, but up to what point? The Christian attitude is unique. It means ardently seeking reconciliation with one’s enemies. It means never holding a grudge or hoping that the other will just recognize his fault and admit how little he knows. It means being humble and not thinking that one’s own imagined reasons for justice will always prevail.

This call from Jesus to live a life without seeking revenge or trying to make others pay back *“all they have done to us”* is truly a very demanding challenge. We need to examine our consciences today to see if we are really following this gospel teaching, especially as regards that person who it is hardest for me to get along with. Then we need to take the necessary steps to change. Do we work hard at forgiving? Do we fight against rancor?

2. The condition for being forgiven is being the first to forgive. This is the meaning of the Our Father: *“as we forgive those who trespass against us.”* When someone knows that he himself is forgiven, he in his turn is quicker to forgive. He who has received free of charge, in his turn gives free of charge. As St. Cyprian teaches: *“There where you were wounded, you are now cured. Love those who you used to hate, those very ones you could not bear.”*

3. Vengeance has no place among Christians. There is no place for the law of the Talon: *“An eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth.”* Our community, our family, our workplace, our friends – all of this is a natural place for acceptance and forgiveness. Let us look around us and ask ourselves: how do we treat others? Are we building a world of vengeance or a universe of forgiveness? God is more human than we are, and when we imitate his behavior, we ourselves become more human.

Peter’s question is also very human: *“How often must I forgive my brother? Seven times?”* But God puts no limits on his generosity: *“I tell you, not just seven times, but seventy times seven times.”* Neither should we put limits when the time comes to forgive our brother. The strength of the Lord will lead us to live in harmony with the way God himself has treated us: we, like Him, will strive to be *“rich in mercy”*.

Hispanic Month/ Mes de la Herencia Hispana

What is Hispanic Heritage Month?

Hispanic Heritage Month celebrates Americans who have ancestry in countries that speak Spanish. That includes Latin America, the Caribbean, and Spain. It was started in 1968 by President Lyndon B. Johnson as a way to celebrate the contributions of Americans who had come to the United States from Spanish-speaking countries. Back then, it was a weeklong celebration. It was expanded to a month in 1988 by President Reagan.

When is Hispanic Heritage Month?

Hispanic Heritage Month starts September 15 (Independence Day in Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua) and continues until October 15. The month also includes Mexico’s Independence Day (September 16) and Chile’s Independence Day (September 18).

What does Hispanic mean?

Hispanic refers to people who speak Spanish or have ancestry from a Spanish-speaking country. Latino, on the other hand, refers to people who are from Latin American countries. There are 20 Hispanic countries, plus Puerto Rico, so 21 countries total.

Why do we celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month?

Hispanic Heritage Month celebrates the 62.1 million Hispanic Americans (18.7% of the U.S. population). It’s a time to learn about important Hispanic figures, learn something new about Hispanic culture, and join in on celebrations across the country.



¿Qué es el Mes de la Herencia Hispana?

El Mes de la Herencia Hispana celebra a los estadounidenses que tienen ascendencia en países que hablan español. Eso incluye América Latina, el Caribe y España. Fue iniciado en 1968 por el presidente Lyndon B. Johnson como una forma de celebrar las contribuciones de los estadounidenses que habían llegado a los Estados Unidos desde países de habla hispana. En aquel entonces, era una celebración que duraba una semana. El presidente Reagan lo amplió a un mes en 1988.

¿Cuándo es el Mes de la Herencia Hispana?

El Mes de la Herencia Hispana comienza el 15 de septiembre (Día de la Independencia en Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras y Nicaragua) y continúa hasta el 15 de octubre. El mes también incluye el Día de la Independencia de México (16 de septiembre) y el Día de la Independencia de Chile (18 de septiembre).

¿Qué significa hispano ?

Hispano se refiere a personas que hablan español o tienen ascendencia de un país de habla hispana. Latino, por otro lado, se refiere a personas que son de países latinoamericanos. Hay 20 países hispanos, más Puerto Rico, por lo que en total son 21 países.

¿Por qué celebramos el Mes de la Herencia Hispana?

El Mes de la Herencia Hispana celebra a los 62,1 millones de hispanoamericanos (18,7% de la población de Estados Unidos). Es un momento para aprender sobre figuras hispanas importantes, aprender algo nuevo sobre la cultura hispana y unirse a celebraciones en todo el país.

PERDONAR SIEMPRE

La oración del Padre nuestro incluye dos peticiones fundamentales para la vida cristiana: “Perdona nuestras ofensas como nosotros perdonamos a los que nos ofenden”. Respondiendo a la pregunta de Pedro sobre los límites del perdón, Jesús narra la parábola de dos corazones, el del rey representa a Dios “rico en misericordia” que perdona y olvida todas nuestras deudas y el del siervo injusto que asfixia a su deudor sin compasión.

Hermanas y hermanos: Si no aprovechamos el tiempo favorable de la misericordia de Dios, tendremos que oír la condena en el juicio final que nos aleja para siempre del amor divino.

1. Lo primero es perdonar, pero ¿hasta donde? La actitud cristiana es la de aquel que busca siempre ardientemente la reconciliación con los que se ha enemistado, de aquel que no quiere mantener la mala cara esperando que el otro reconozca su culpa y venga a decir que le sabe muy mal, aquel que no quiere hacer valer el derecho de la razón que se imagina tener.

Esta llamada de Jesús a vivir sin deseos de venganza ni de ganas de hacer pagar al otro “lo que nos ha hecho”, es algo verdaderamente exigente. Debemos hacer hoy un buen examen de conciencia y ver si seguimos esta enseñanza evangélica en la relación con aquella persona que me resulta antipática y hacer los propósitos que sean necesarios. ¿Nosotros nos esforzamos en perdonar? ¿Procuramos no guardar rencor?

2. La condición para ser perdonado es perdonar primero. Este es el sentido de la oración del Padrenuestro: "así como nosotros perdonamos a nuestros deudores". Quien se sabe perdonado, lo normal es que perdone. Quien ha recibido gratis, lo normal es que dé también gratis. Como enseña San Cipriano: “Allí donde estabas herido, has quedado curado. Ama a los que antes odiabas, aquellos mismos a los que no podías soportar.”

3. En un ambiente cristiano no cabe la venganza: Aquella ley del Talión, "ojo por ojo, diente por diente". Nuestra comunidad, nuestra familia, el lugar de trabajo, los amigos, son el ambiente natural de la acogida y el perdón. Miremos a nuestro alrededor y preguntémonos: ¿Cómo nos relacionamos con los demás? ¿Estamos construyendo un mundo de venganza o un universo de perdón? Dios es más humano que nosotros; apropiándonos sus comportamientos, nos humanizamos.

La pregunta que hace Pedro es también muy humana: "¿cuántas veces tengo que perdonar a mi hermano? ¿Hasta siete veces?" Pero Dios no pone límites a su generosidad: "No te digo hasta siete veces, sino hasta setenta veces siete". Tampoco nosotros debemos poner límites al momento de perdonar a los hermanos. La fuerza del Señor nos llevará a situarnos en sintonía con el comportamiento que Dios tiene con cada uno de nosotros.

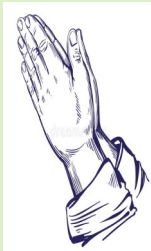
